The Kingswood Campsite summer camping season is open from June 24 – September 5 to individuals, families, couples and groups. You decide when to come and how long to stay!

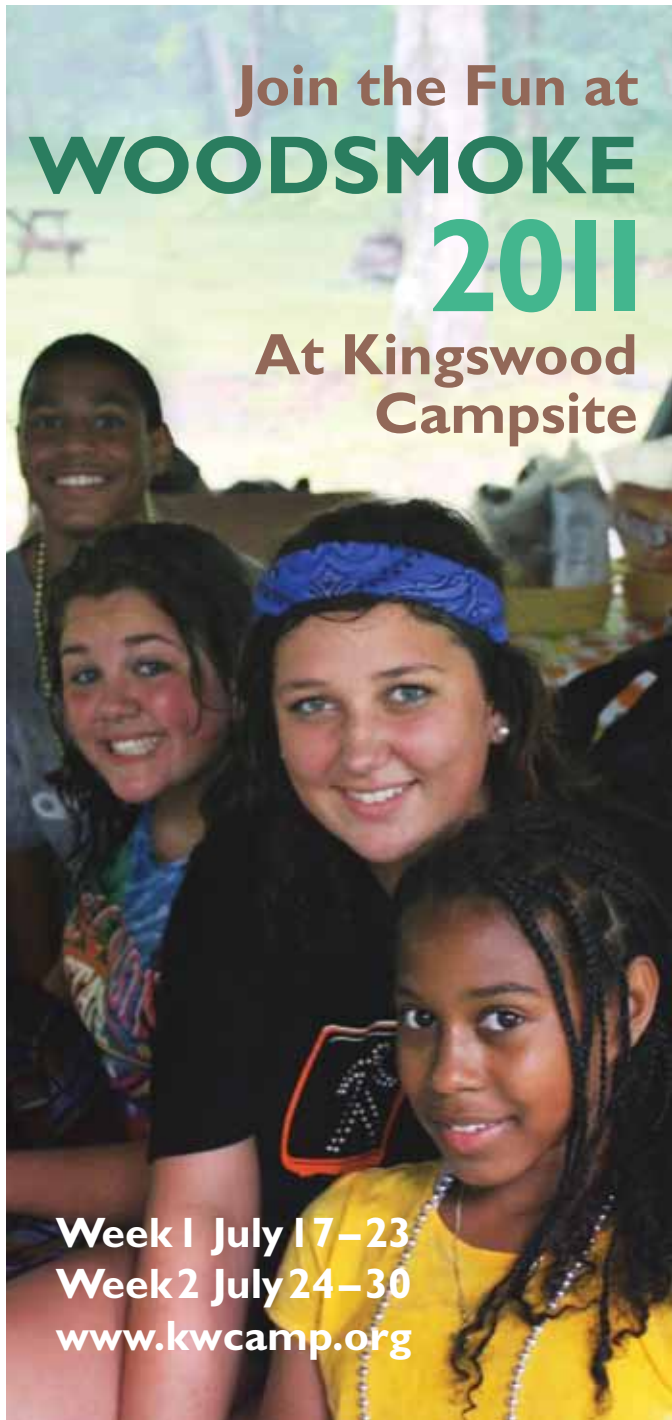

### Facilities (see [www.kwcamp.org](http://www.kwcamp.org) for photos)

Campers stay in equipped sites, with two platform tents (one each for boys and girls), including wooden bunks with mattresses and storage areas, sheltered outdoor kitchen/dining area, latrine and surrounding woods and fields. Showers are provided in the nearby Oasis bathhouse.

### Staff

Two experienced, trained counselors (1 male and 1 female) supervise each group. All-camp staff includes the program director, registered nurse, 2 lifeguards, chaplain, food coordinators, project managers, and the site manager.

### Group size

Cove has openings for 8 youth each week (4 boys and 4 girls). Maples, Hogan and Eagle accept 10 youth each week (5 boys and 5 girls). Activities are planned to assist in building community within each group, as well as large all-camp activities, such as swim time, chapel, and the Friday evening all-camp cookout.

WOODSMOKE is committed to providing a positive camp experience for all youth regardless of religious, ethnic or economic background. Please call Julie Wityk for information on applying for scholarship assistance.

### Grades 5-6 (Cove Week 1 and Maples Week 2)

How do you arrange wood to make a good campfire? What animal left those tracks in the mud? Why does the beaver build a dam, and how does he do it? Why are newts bright orange? Find out the answers to these questions and more in the Cove groups.

You will learn camp skills, cook together (bring a favorite recipe and we'll see if we can make it over a wood fire!), play lots of outdoor games, hike, make banana boats and hand-cranked ice cream (yummy!), slosh through water on the Stream Walk (a Cove tradition - bring old sneakers!) and trek around camp on various missions. There's lots to discover!

### Grades 7-8 (Maples Week 1 and Hogan Week 2)\*

The Maples campers will spend several mornings each week on an important service project. We are determining those projects and will post them on the website this spring – keep checking [www.kwcamp.org/Woodsmoke](http://www.kwcamp.org/Woodsmoke).

Other activities include hiking, a brr-isk early morning "Polar Bear" swim, outdoor games and activities, lunch in the boats while floating in the middle of the lake, and the infamous "Monk's Dinner," a hilarious way to enjoy a camp meal!

### Grades 9-10 (Hogan Week 1 and Eagle Week 2)\*

Hogan campers will continue building the brand new Access Friendly Equipped Campsite begun last summer. Over the years, some of our family campers have had physical difficulty using a regular site. This new site is designed to sit on level ground and minimize the distance between sleeping, eating and latrine facilities. ### Grades 11-12 (Eagle Week 1)\*

Back by popular demand, Eagle campers will work on P.E.T. vehicles during Week 1. P.E.T. stands for Personal Energy Transportation ([website: www.petinternational.org](http://www.petinternational.org)). Under the guidance of project leaders from East Jewett United Methodist Church, you will be building the P.E.T. vehicle, which is an arm-powered wheelchair designed to provide the gift of mobility to millions of people who have lost the use of their legs due to polio, landmine injury, amputation and other illnesses or injury. The vehicle looks like a cross between a wheelbarrow, a tricycle and a go-cart. It is sturdy and easily maintained in outpost areas. You learn and make use of skills in carpentry, metal working, painting and sewing in a worthwhile project that truly makes a difference in the lives of others! The vehicles you work on will be sent to places such as Mexico, Honduras, El Salvador, Guatemala, Chad, Zambia and Sierra Leone.
